


Safety in the Use of Gas.

Maintaining a public safety system which is comparable with the best in the world was the focus of the New Zealand gas industry's recent consumer safety initiative.

The LPG and Gas Associations, working with Energy Safety, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and the Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainlayers Board; have recently run a national gas safety campaign to remind and encourage consumers to install, use, and maintain gas appliances safely.

The website www.gassafety.org.nz promotes all the tips consumers need to know to use gas safely and efficiently, both in the home and while caravanning.



Health and Safety Reform Bill.

The Bill was introduced into Parliament in March 2014. It is currently before Parliament's Transport and Industrial Relations Committee, which is considering public submissions on the Bill.

Once the Bill is passed, it will be several months before the new Health and Safety at Work Act comes fully into force in 2015. This will enable the supporting regulations to be made, and WorkSafe NZ to finalise the supporting guidance and approved codes of practice.

The new law will be supported by education and information. WorkSafe NZ is developing a range of guidance material that will be in place in plenty of time to help you through the transition.

The latest update from WorkSafe NZ (www.business.govt.nz/worksafe) focuses on Points 1 to 8 (left). Future updates will explain the framework of supporting regulations and guidance. Future updates will also include additional issues identified as being of particular interest to stakeholders.

It is important that members understand the Duty or Primary Care and the responsibilities of a Person Conducting a Business or Undertaking, known as a PCBU.

It is recommended all members check out the WorkSafe NZ website which has all the information you will need to know.
