Looking to 2010

Council is considering holding a number of focus group sessions in key locations around the country in early 2010 to gain further insight into what members want from their Institution. Communications with and amongst members is vitally important and a key benefit of membership. To this end Council will undertake to communicate more regularly and frequently. In 2010 you can look forward to quarterly newsletters and the introduction of monthly (Feb-Nov) e-bulletins.

NZ Institution of Gas Engineers and Managers (NZIGEM)

As previously reported it is pleasing that it is all go with NZIGEM after many years of effort. By now if you had signed up for NZIGEM you should be receiving an electronic copy of the IGEM feature publication Gas International and the more frequent e-newsletter, IGEM Flame.

Membership fees for NZIGEM remain at \$62 incl GST and were included in the NZIGE subscription invoice sent out in early June. The NZIGEM Subscription Year is aligned with NZIGE (1 June 2009 to 31 May 2010)

Subscription invoices were sent to members in the first week of June for the subscription year commencing 1 June 2009, with a due date for payment of 1 August 2009.

Each year a small number of members fail to pay by the due date (in many instances the same people) and Council can spend an inordinate amount of time chasing up what typically amounts to very little money.



You have to laugh

From the Herald Sun, November 27, 2009 **A PORTLY pig with flatulence triggered a minor emergency near Bendigo this week when smells wafting from the 120kg porker sparked fears of a potentially dangerous gas leak.**



Two Country Fire Authority tankers and 15 fire fighters turned out in darkness to search the source of the leak at a property at Axedale, east of Bendigo. But the likely culprit was soon sniffed out, the pet sow startled from slumber in the dead of night.

"She got very excited when two trucks and 15 firies turned up and she squealed and farted and squealed and farted," said fire chief Peter Harkins.

"I haven't heard too many pigs fart but I would describe it as very full-on."

Mr Harkins said the family had done the right thing by calling 000 to report a suspected gas leak: "It's all bottled gas up here and a leaking cylinder could pose a major fire risk.

"It was because we took it so seriously that 15 volunteers still managed to attend the call out at 10:30 on Tuesday night."

Mr Hawkins said the day had been both wet and warm, as well as slightly humid.

"Smells are always exacerbated in those conditions. We got to the property and we could smell a very strong odour in the vicinity.

"It didn't take us too long to work it out because we could both smell and hear her."

The pig, a family pet, was lying low yesterday, her embarrassed owners refusing media requests for a photograph of their porker. She is believed to be a friendly and docile animal, a much loved children's pet, possibly in need of a change in diet.

It was the pig's owners who reported a possible gas leak and CFA volunteers turned out in force

because of fears any potential leak could spark fires in forests behind the property. Mr Hawkins played down claims by some locals the smell could have been sulphur from a nearby gold mine, one of few still working in Victoria. "There were 15 of us there and the little kid in all of us came out because we all got the giggles, as you do when you are talking farts. We were in no doubt the source of the smell."
